Nordictrack rowers reviews

In terms of design and overall quality, Peloton stationary bikes are great... but they're not really any better than rival workout bikes in the same price range. The reason Peloton is so popular right now has precious little to do with the bike itself, and far more to do with the screen attached to it. A Peloton bike isn't just a stationary bike, it's a portal into a world of interactive workouts designed to maximize your results from each session. Leisurely pedaling away on a regular exercise bike while you watch reruns of Everybody Loves Raymond is a good workout. But drenching your clothes in sweat while a trainer on your Peloton screen pushes you to the limit is a much, much better workout. That's the idea behind the NordicTrack RW900 Rower, a fantastic modern rowing machine that I have been testing for a little over a month now. It includes all the features you might want in a high-end rower, plus a huge 22-inch touchscreen display that is a gateway to 30 built-in workouts as well as hundreds of additional interactive workouts that are available courtesy of iFit integration. But that's just the tip of the iceberg. Why are gym memberships and personal trainers so popular? After all, people would save tons of money over time if they just bought some workout gear and exercised at home. The simple fact of the matter is that exercising in a public setting, especially with a trainer, drives most people to work out harder. You'll never burn as many calories at home alone as you will with a trainer doing everything he or she can to push you to your limit. The idea behind the RW900 Rower specifically, you get 30 built-in workouts led by coaches who talk you through each phase as you virtually row along dozens of different bodies of water around the world. On top of that, the machine connects you to iFit Coach, a service that gives you access to tons of interactive workouts that are either live or available on-demand. And when I say "interactive," I mean truly interactive. You don't just watch the screen and try to follow along with the trainer, the RW900's magnetic resistance will actually increase and decrease automatically as the instructor goes through his or her workout. It's fantastic, and it means you can focus on giving it your all instead of constantly breaking your rhythm to increase or decrease the rower's resistance. The interactive features of the RW900 Rower are clearly the biggest selling point, but sometimes you're in the mood for a more relaxing row. After all, rowing is one of the best cardio workouts you can do. It's lower impact than running and burns far more calories, plus it hits just about every muscle group and is a great core workout. So when you're not in the mood for an intense interactive workout, a few taps on the 22-inch display set you up with a manual workout, where you can row at your own pace for however long you'd like. Or, if you really want to shut off your brain and watch Everybody Loves Raymond reruns while you row, you can rotate the screen 90° in either direction for an unobstructed view of your TV. There is an HDMI port on back of the RW900's display, but it's an HDMI out rather than an input so you can't connect a different video source. It's easy to fixate on the giant touchscreen and all the cool, interactive features that come along with it, but the RW900 Rower is also a fantastic premium rowing machine without all of those extra features. It's incredibly well-built and has a foldable design so it can easily be stowed out of the way. It's also remarkably smooth, the ergonomic cushioned seat is comfortable, the "Quick-Adjust" pedal system makes it great for multiple users, and it has 10 different levels of manual air resistance in addition to 26 levels of silent magnetic resistance that adjust digitally. The RW900 is as quiet a rower as I've ever used, which is great for focusing on the interactive training sessions — or on Everybody Loves Raymond, if you must. The only real downsides I've found so far are the fact that the HDMI port can't be used as an HDMI in, and the fact that the RW900 is only rated for a maximum weight capacity of 250 lbs. Most comparable rowers are rated for at least 300 lbs, but heavier people won't be able to count the RW900 among their options when shopping for a new rower. With a retail price of \$1,999, the RW900 is not cheap. Even with the sale price of \$1,599 on the NordicTrack website that doesn't seem to be going away anytime soon, the RW900 Rower is still among the priciest options in its class. But thanks to the build quality and all of the awesome interactive features brought to life by that great big touchscreen display, it's worth every penny. The NordicTrack RW900 Rower combines a fantastic design with modern technology to deliver the best interactive rowing workout I have ever experienced. It is undoubtedly my new favorite exercise machine. As a matter of fact, I haven't touched my stationary bike or treadmill a single time since NordicTrack sent me an RW900 to test more than a month ago. However, this is very much pitched as a premium level rowing machine and it compares very favourably with even some of its more expensive rivals. Perhaps the standout feature of the RW900 when you first view it is the huge 22 inch capacitive touch screen and although this is impressive, there are other elements in terms of design and functionality that are equally pleasing. We took the RW900 for a 30 day review... here's what we found. NordicTrack RW900 is one of the highest spec'd home rowers we have come across. From the 22 inch touch screen display to the 26 levels of fluid resistance in addition to 10 levels of air resistance, a folding mechanism and tilting foot pads - it seems that NordicTrack have thought of everything when it comes to this premium home rower. Measuring up at 218cm x 55cm x 125cm (L,W,H) when folded, the RW900 takes up a similar floor space to most commercial rowers but has the added benefit of being easily storable thanks to its clever folding design. Quite often when we see folding exercise equipment it comes at a cost in terms of functionality or stability - there are no such issues here and in fact, we would go as far to say it is one of most well spec'd rowing machines we have seen. Weighing in at 49kg, this is not a lightweight model, but the addition of transport wheels to the front of the unit make moving the rower in to a storage space easy enough. The maximum user weight of the RW900 is 130kg. Almost everything on the RW900 is 130k designed and is actually comfortable (not just bearable) to sit on. The foot pads are also adjustable so you can workout with the exception of the manual air resistance is done at the touch of a button and is all you will need to use once you have an appropriate level of air resistance set. There is also a 12 month family membership of iFit Live that comes supplied as standard with this rower that gives you access to thousands of workouts as well as live sessions which is great for keeping motivated and connected to others when working out at home. This is an extremely well made piece of kit and it is backed by a 10 year frame warranty (2 year parts, 1 year labour) and with the track record of NordicTrack you just know it is going to last for years and years - unlike some of the budget competitive models. The RW900 colour screen shows all of the data you need including total strokes, strokes per minute, total time, 500m split times, calories and distance. You can easily select a pre-set program or manually select the difficulty level using the fluid resistance. The RW900 uses SMR technology which stands for silent magnetic resistance. The SMR also produces a smooth and fluid motion and the handles are incredibly comfortable to the touch with a soft touch ergonomic design. Whether you are looking to use the RW900 for fat burning cardio, high intensity workouts, improving stamina - it is up to the task and does it in style. One downside to this rower is that you will have to unplug the screen when putting the machine away as there is no power button to the screen. This is not a huge issue although some users have complained about this. Our VerdictThe NordicTrack RW900 is an exceptional home rowing machine. In fact, it is more than that as it offers full body workouts with live support from actual trainers remotely. It is easy to set up, easy to use and easy to store and will go easy on your joints while providing you with a gruelling workout. You also get 26 resistance levels and 30 built in programs in addition to all of the features and capabilities that the RW200 offers. How Do NordicTrack Rowing Machines Compare to the Competition? According to our reviews NordicTrack rowers stack up quite well against the competition, especially the lower to mid range brands. The RW600, RW700 and RW900 give you features that you just don't find on other machines, even the more expensive ones. One thing that definitely separates the NordicTrack rowing machines from the others is iFit. You will find elements of the program elsewhere, but no other system gives you endless workout choices, Google maps of any location and tracking/sharing capability, along with nutrition recommendations and in-studio on demand classes. You can't find iFit on any other rowing machine, even sister company ProForm's 440R rower, which is made by the same manufacturer ICON Fitness.Other separators include the touch screen displays that you don't typically find on residential rowing machines. That's a lot better coverage than you get on most rowers these days. How do they compare to the higher end brands? The previous RW200 at \$1599 didn't really compete with the commercial brands, but the RW600 at around \$999, RW700 at around \$1299 and RW900 at \$1599 definitely do. That's the only comparison where NordicTrack falls a bit short. The RW900 definitely has more bells and whistles than everyone else, but as far as durability and advanced computing, it doesn't quite compare to brands like Concept 2 and WaterRower, even though it is similarly priced. For example, the Concept 2 model D has a max weight capacity of 500 lbs., which is double the max user weight on the RW600, RW700 and RW900. So you really have to decide if you want a lot of extras and entertainment, or commercial quality and precise workout stats, at least as far as the RW600, RW700 and RW900 are concerned. NordicTrack Rowers - Bottom Line We like the NordicTrack rowing machines, and user reviews have been quite positive. The iFit technology takes your workouts to a whole new level, with plenty of features to keep you motivated and entertained. You get a lot of built in programs, comfortable seat, adjustable foot straps and console, music compatibility with speaker system, plenty of resistance levels and strong warranties on all machines. Casual rowers will appreciate all of the extras on the RW600, RW700 and RW900, but more serious rowers will be better served with a Concept 2 rower, which is less expensive and much more commercial-grade. Still, with everything they have to offer, NordicTrack rowers remain extremely popular, with plenty of satisfied customers.
